AUG. 13 TUESDAY TALK
OX-BOW: LIVING IN SAND FOR OVER 100 YEARS

AUGUST 2, 2013-- The August 13 Tuesday Talk at the Saugatuck-Douglas Historical Society will feature Elizabeth Chodos, Executive Director of Ox-Bow, presenting "Ox-Bow: Living In Sand For Over 100 Years". The event is free and open to the public and will take place at 11 a.m. in the History Center at the Old Schoolhouse, 130 Center Street in Douglas. It will last one hour and include a question-and-answer session.

Chodos will discuss the history of Ox-Bow, how historical art movements influenced its founders, and the way which its programs have evolved.
